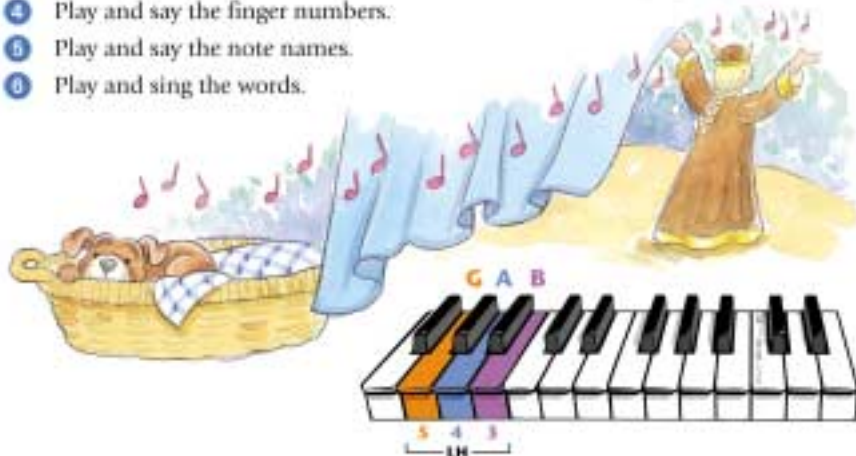

"Do tell us," purred Clara Schumann-Cat. It had been quite a while since she had heard music as grand as this.

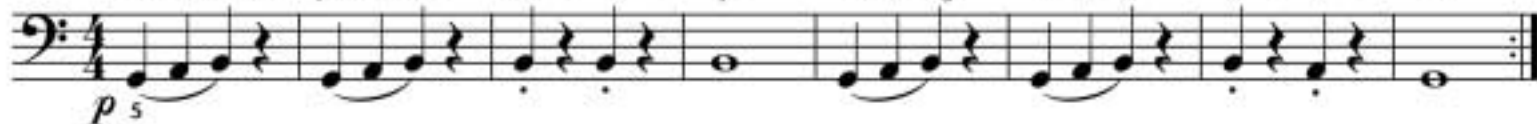
